## Packing Requirements

## INTRODUCTION:

to arrange all shipments of Artworks sold to our customers.
These packing requirements were created in consultation with

For each type of Artwork (defined by category and size), we are specifying:

- the minimum standards for packing

AND

- the recommended method of packing.

We are also providing links to sources where the recommended packing materials are available to purchase.

Our goal is to establish clear standards and expectations on how works must be packed for safe shipping (the minimum requirements), while also giving you flexibility and resources to make choices.

## YOU WILL PROVIDE DIMENSIONS TO TEAM in advance with catalog details.

- We need accurate unframed dimensions for all works

AND

- If a work is framed, we need accurate framed dimensions for all works
- If a work is matted but not framed, we need accurate matted dimensions for all works

Accuracy is important so that we can provide accurate shipping quotes to customers.

When packing the Artwork for shipment, refer to the last page of this document, to make sure that the actual packed dimensions don't exceed the size of the Strong Box that would accommodate the Artwork.

- Example: if a work is $20 \times 20 \times 2$ inches, the appropriate Strong Box would measure $29 \times 26 \times 5$ inches. Even if your art handler uses another kind of box, it should not be larger than $29 \times 26 \times 5$ inches. If the packaging is larger, the shipping fee we charge customers will be too low.


## SOFT PACKING VS CRATING:

- The maximum dimensions for artwork that can be soft packed without a crate are $49 \times 3 \times 40$ inches.
- The packed dimensions of the artwork when soft packed cannot exceed $57 \times 8 \times 46$ inches.
- Crating is required for international shipping when the customer has chosen a fine art shipper.
- If a work is shipping internationally by fine art shipper and therefore needs a crate:
- You will need to soft pack the work per the instructions in this guide in advance of the art carrier's arrival.
- The art carrier will bring the crate and pack the work (which must already be soft packed) in the crate.
- The customer will be charged for the crate and crating service.
- If a work is shipping internationally by common carrier(ex: FedEx), you should follow the soft packing in this guide (do not crate).

How should you soft pack an artwork for crating?

- Soft packing varies based on the medium used for the artwork and the fragility of the surface. Please speak with Dietl if you have any questions.
- For framed work, please wrap the work in plastic and bubble wrap.
- For unframed work wrap in glassine and a cardboard portfolio.
- For three-dimensional work, please wrap with tissue and bubble wrap or ask $\square$ for advice.


## Requirements for All Artwork Categories and Sizes

## ARTWORK FRAMED UNDER GLASS:

- The surface of the glass must be taped if the glass stays in the frame. This helps to prevents damage to the Artwork if the glass shatters.
- The glass must be removed from the frame if:
- it is not possible to tape the surface of the glass. For example, museum / Den glass cannot be taped.
- the glass exceeds $20 \times 30$ inches
- glass that exceeds $20 \times 30$ inches cannot be shipped at all

If the glass is under $20 \times 30$ inches in size, soft pack the glass separately in foam core, then place it inside the same packaging as the artwork.

## Canvases or Framed Flatworks .25 inches or greater in thickness

MINIMUM REQUIRED APPROACH:

- 500 LB double wall (DW) corrugated cardboard or 2 sheets of single wall cardboard combined with alternated corrugation.
- Individual works must have at least 1-2 inches of foam surrounding the work on all sides.
- We recommend all works be sealed in plastic within the cardboard boxes with appropriate underlaying between the Artwork and the plastic, in order to avoid damaging the Artwork.
- All edges on completed packaging should be sealed with packing tape.

RECOMMENDED APPROACH \& MATERIALS:

Pack in a Strongbox* with the following specifications:

- 500 LB double wall (DW) corrugated cardboard. These corrugated strongboxes are treated with a moisture resistant coating on the exterior.
- ECT 44 (Edge Crush Test 44 is higher than the typical industry 32 and significantly stronger than a typical 'slipcase' made from a single sheet of single wall cardboard many gallery handlers use).
- FOAM: Each strongbox is foamed out with two to four layers of 1.25 inch perforated foam that can be easily and quickly removed by layer to fit the flatwork perfectly. Amount of foam depends on size of box.
- PUNCTURE GUARD: Strongboxes come with a puncture guard that is adhered to the interior lid and bottom face of the strongbox. The puncture guard is . 04 heavy duty utility grade plastic, extremely difficult to puncture.

## Unframed Artworks under .25 inches in thickness \& larger than $13 \times 10$ inches

MINIMUM REQUIRED APPROACH:

- 500 LB double wall (DW) corrugated cardboard or 2 sheets of single wall cardboard combined with alternated corrugation.
- Artwork sheets need to be secured inside the portfolio at a minimum of all 4 corners.
- Artwork should be sealed in plastic with a glassine layer between the plastic and the Artwork to protect the Artwork from the Plastic.
- Use puncture proof sheets of plastic if possible
- All edges on the completed packaging should be sealed with packing tape.

RECOMMENDED APPROACH \& MATERIALS:

Pack in print pads or portfolio packs with the following specifications:

- Print pads/portfolios are double walled cardboard with a rigid plastic puncture guard.
- Edges fold over onto themselves which creates a very thin, puncture proof, rigid box/portfolio about 1 inch thick when done.
- Minimal internal packing is needed other than securing the sheet in place and making sure it's wrapped in glassine or the appropriate thin layer of protection that your gallery typically uses.

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## Unframed Artworks under .25 inches in thickness \& smaller than $13 \times 10$ inches

MINIMUM REQUIRED APPROACH
RECOMMENDED APPROACH \& MATERIALS:

- Pack in a rigid envelope with cardboard inserts larger than the Artwork for extra rigidity

Same as minimum requirements

- We suggest covering your small work with a layer of glassine or other equivalent material and then inserting into the envelope between two additional cardboard dividers.

## Lightweight posters or prints that can be safely rolled

MINIMUM REQUIRED APPROACH:

- Roll artwork together with glassine or other equivalent material [like silicone release paper] layered under the artwork, so that when rolled, the glassine layer is interleaved with the poster layer. Glassine should extend past the ends of the rolled artwork by at least $1 / 2$ inch on either end.
- NOTE: be careful not to roll the poster too tightly (to avoid crimping), but also not so loosely that there isn't room to also wrap it in bubble wrap before inserting in the tube (see next step).
- Wrap the finished glassine/poster roll in a couple of layers of small-bubble bubble-wrap. The wrapped roll should closely match the inside diameter of the tube - with limited empty space in the tube so that the roll isn't knocked around in transit.
- Place roll in tube, adding bubble inside both the top and bottom of the tube, again, to limit empty space and prevent shifting up and down in the tube.
